Arbiter SYSTEM CLEAN UP:

If you do not plan on refereeing in 2020 or have moved out of the area and will not be returning, please let me know so I can remove you from the system.

All games will be removed from the system on Jan 18th. This gives you plenty of time to download your games for tracking game count towards upgrade. To download:

- 1. Login to Arbiter and click on Schedule
- 2. Under REPORTS on the left side, click Schedule
- 3. Enter the From/To dates and select the format you want your games exported in
- 4. Click Print Preview and save the form to your computer.
- 5. GAMES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR DOWNLOAD AFTER I REMOVE THEM

CSL Pay Raise:

1. Charleston Soccer League Adult Amateur referees will receive a pay raise for working CSL games beginning with the 2020 season. Men's 11v11 will now pay \$70/\$45/\$45 and Coed will pay \$60/\$40/\$40. This is an increase for both 11v11 leagues. Short sided games will continue to pay \$30 each.

2. Pay raises were focused primarily on center referee pay in an effort to increase desire to work middles on Adult games.

"What do I need to do in order to get higher paying games?"

A discussion was held during the meeting to discuss this topic. Several referees and parents of youth referees ask how they can receive assignments other than AR's on U11/12 games. The answer is simple – BECOME A CENTER REFEREE!

1. We have too many referees who want to work as AR's only and never show an interest in centering a match. We all understand being nervous about having the responsibility as the center official during the match, we all started there. But you cannot learn how to do it if you never try. Practice only makes you better!! Mistakes are expected and you learn from them each time.

2. Each year, 100+ new referees sign up and need a place to start as AR's. If you are unwilling to work centers, you greatly limit the number of assignments available to you.

3. Higher level games require more of a team effort and cannot be left to the center referee alone to call the game and need AR's who <u>can identify and are willing to call fouls.</u>

4. Contact your assignor if you are interested in stepping up and working centers.

5. Coastal PDL is a great opportunity for us to get inexperienced referees a chance to become comfortable working centers on lower level games. The 1st and 2nd periods of these games are non-competitive and **yelling at the referees from coaches and parents is strictly forbidden** and will be handled immedately upon notifying the club. Contact the Coastal PDL assignor (Kris Kenney) if you have any spectator or coach issues during the match.

6. These games are for learning/training purposes. AR1 should be centering the 1st period and AR2 centering the 2nd period for experience and exposure as a center referee. The 3rd period is competitive and should be centered by the person listed as Referee in Arbiter.

7. Make sure you do a self-evaluation after every match and ask questions of the referee crew so you can learn. Refs don't learn if they don't receive feedback.

CASRA Dues:

We are operating under the new CASRA Dues system now. No dues required until June 1st, 2020.
Other than brand new, 1st year USSF registered referees, ALL RETURNING MEMBERS PAY
There is no longer a student/non-student dues structure. Those returning to CASRA after a break in membership or moving to the area as a certified USSF referee will have to pay the membership fee upon joining.

Meeting Location Needed:

With the closure of MUSC Health Stadium, CASRA has lost the use of the 3 Lions Pub to hold our training classes and General Membership meetings. If anyone has access to a room that can accommodate 50-60 people (audio/visual equipment is a plus), please let me know. The organization cannot afford to pay much for access to space, but we will entertain any and all suggestions.
